What is peer modeling and what are the benefits?

Also called reverse inclusion

Program where typically developing children attend a special education classroom to serve as role models.

Benefits for all children!

- > Promote an appreciation of similarities and differences of self and others.
- Typically developing peer models learn leadership skills, patience, and empathy.
- > Children with special needs learn language, social, and play skills by following their peers' lead.



Our Program Basics

- Classes are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.
- Peer Models will be assigned to one of two classes:
 - > The morning class runs from 7:45 AM-10:45 AM.
 - > The afternoon class runs from 11:50 AM-2:50 PM.
- * We follow the <u>Southern Door Elementary calendar</u>.
- There is a teacher and a full-time associate in the classroom.
- Peer Models must be potty trained.

Play Based Instruction

- Playing is learning!
- Helps development in all areas
 - > Social
 - > Communication
 - > Cognitive
 - > Gross Motor
 - > Fine Motor

What are we looking for in Peer Model children?

- Strong language skills
 - > Answers questions, vast vocabulary



- > Seeks proximity to others, greets peers/adults, enjoys cooperative play
- Strong play skills
 - Able to play independently and with others, uses imagination
- Good behavior
 - > Follows directions, Seeks adult approval

- Thank you for your interest in our program! Once your form has been submitted, Mrs. Ramel will be in contact with you to further discuss your application, and to answer any questions you might have.
- Spaces are limited. Staff will make Admissions decisions based on the best fit for Early Childhood students.
- Peer Models must live within the Southern Door County School District, or be a child of a Southern Door County School District employee.
- Peer Models must be 3-4 years old and not yet enrolled in school.
- Peer Models must be potty trained.
- Parent/Guardian(s) of Peer Models are responsible for providing their child's daily, on-time transportation to and from school.
 - > Regular, on-time attendance is important for establishing peer relationships in this program.
- Please Note: Southern Door County School District reserves the right to dismiss any Peer Model who is not able to act as a role model child within the program. We reserve the right to discontinue the Peer Model program, either temporarily or long-term, in the event that the services/support needs of our Early Childhood students change or otherwise exceed our staffing ability to include Peer Model children in the classroom.
- The standard Elementary Materials Fee applies.
 - > If the program is discontinued mid-year, the fee will be refunded to you on a prorated basis.
- School Food Service is not available to Peer Models.
 - > Peer Models are encouraged to bring a cold breakfast (morning class) or lunch (afternoon class) from home if desired.
